Not Ready for Prime Time. What role should the U.S. - Japan alliance play in the East Asian region with potential flashpoints? This question is, of course, being hotly debated in the Japanese Diet and in the media. It is also being studied and researched at various universities, institutions, think tanks and numerous other NGOs.

However, given the current political turmoil in Japan there are many bottlenecks and obstacles to making any tangible movement on basic questions such as:

- 1) Exercising Japan's right to self defense, or 2) Making serious review of the constitution. Looking at the current geopolitical reality in a Global Era, while keeping one eye on domestic Japanese politics, it's time to re-examine the possibility and priority of Japan's involvement in the whole region. Therefore, we would like to offer a new closed forum (Track 2) for exchanging candid dialogue.
- **1. Regional scope**: In addition to conventional Far East Asia, we will add India, the rest of Asia, the Middle East, and Africa
- **2. Collaborators**: The Gulf Research Center (GRC), UAE's non-profit think tank, will join various U.S. and Japanese organizations.
- <u>3. Participants</u>: In addition to experts from think tanks and universities, invitees include non-partisan Diet members and related government officials, business and defense industry representatives, NPO's, embassy staff and the media.
- **4. Purpose**: Create a comfortable, non-public atmosphere where leaders from political and economic realms and the defense industry can candidly exchange views on how to vigorously and creatively build sustainable peace and security in the region.
